Targets include:

- Delivering a low carbon blue economy that contributes to our climate change targets.
- Contributing to an innovative, globally competitive, sustainable blue economy with quality jobs and fair work for its participants.
- Fair and inclusive growth that maximises opportunities for people and communities in Scotland.

This fund may be suitable for:

- Skippers wanting to make their boats more economical
- Small Infrastructure projects to work towards net-zero
- Research to enable better decision making
- Development of prototypes or delivering pilot projects

Example Projects:

- Upgrading harbour electrics so it is easier to access for the fleet and with more controlled use for contractors
- More energy efficient propellers
- Hull improvements to streamline the vessel

Funding rates:

Organisation	Total public money as a % of the total eligible costs
Private, where the project is wholly commercial	Up to 50%
Private (organisations of fishers/collectives of fishers) (up to an additional 10% of grant funding can be offered to fishers acting in a collective manner)	Up to 60%
Public law bodies	Up to 100%
Projects involving private entities and/or third sector bodies including collaborative working to deliver collective benefits and/or interests which don't accrue to a single commercial entity, such as industry-wide benefits or benefits to multiple beneficiaries*	Up to 100%

The UK Infrastructure Fund

The objectives of the Infrastructure Scheme are to:

- Boost industry capability at ports and across processing and aquaculture and other onshore facilities to sustainably land, process and add value to produce
- Contribute to levelling up to support and develop coastal communities
- **Contribute to the Government's targets on Net Zero by investing in infrastructure projects that aim to offset carbon emissions over time**

This fund will be for projects worth between £250,000 and £5,000,000, so for much larger projects.

All funding must be used by March 2024.

This fund may be suitable for:

- Large harbour infrastructure projects to support the transition to net-zero



The Fishing Industry Science Partnership Scheme

A scheme aimed to Improve and share knowledge of fisheries and aquaculture by funding projects that are steered by a partnership between industry and scientists.

Lots are:

- Fisheries data collection
- Mixed fisheries and selectivity
- Environmental impacts of aquaculture.
